

Doctor of Divinity (D. Div.)

The fundamental goal of the Doctor of Divinity program is to help ministers develop a more effective ministry through a critical and informed reflection upon the experience gained in the practice of ministry. The Doctor of Divinity Degree as a two-year program requires ministers to have a teaching understanding of all sixty-six (66) Books of the Bible. The Doctor of Ministry Program is open to applicants who have completed the Master of Divinity (M.Div.) or its equivalent and the applicant has demonstrated the ability to do academic work at the graduate level. The demonstration of such ability will be evidenced by a demonstrated quality in communication skills, and cognitive ability as ascertained in a review of the application packet.

Candidates must complete the Core Curriculum and demonstrate an understanding of the doctrines of Christianity and the significance of the Gospel and relate it to the Book Genesis. Additionally, candidates for this degree must satisfactorily complete a comprehensive written requirement. Persons with a Master of Divinity degree or its formal equivalent are eligible to become applicants to the program.
