

Master of Divinity (M. Div.)

The Master of Divinity Degree is a two-year program for ministers called to be pastors, evangelists and teachers. It serves as the basis for future doctoral work. Admission to the program is open to all ordained ministers with an earned Bachelor of Theology or its equivalent (e.g. experiential knowledge of the Eighteen (18) Points of Biblical Doctrine) is eligible to apply. If the student does not have these prerequisites, he may complete them through the Frederick L. Ray Biblical Institute.

Applications may be submitted at any time, but application review will be subject to the scheduled application deadlines for admission during a given term.

Ordained ministers who choose to enter the Frederick L. Ray Biblical Institute contemplating theological study should correspond immediately with the Student Services Representative. Such correspondence will help prepare students for their anticipated program of study.
